EFAI Gives Grant

Once again, Villa Infantil has been chosen to receive grants from the Educational Foundation of the Americas, Inc. to use for education purposes.

For the past several years, EFAI has generously given grants to ten of the children at the orphanage. This year the Foundation increased the number of recipients to twelve children.

These grants certainly help the Villa defray education expenses in a big way.

Madre Maria has always said that education is a key to ensuring a better life for her many children. Her philosophy fits that of EFAI to a "T."

The children are taught English as part of their education which is a requirement in Mexico for qualifying for higher education.

For many years, Trish Connor has presented Madre with a donation from San

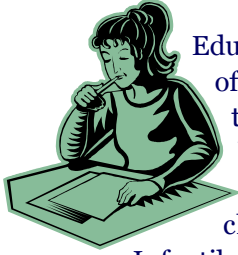
Andres Catholic Church in Ajijic for a year's supply of bottled water for the Villa.
